


# Codex 2019 survey - Frequency of major emerging issues in Food Safety and Quality in NEA

### Figure 1: Examples of difficulties with the use of Codex standards in the CCNE region













### FAO - WHO new assessment approach proposed










### Benefits of implementing the assessment at a National level



### Benefits of implementing the assessment at a Regional level

Helps **building** a **regional vision** and **mutual recognition** grounded in a **common understanding** of food control systems' design and operation

reference to a single instrument (FAO/WHO tool for analyzing food control systems)



Anchored on Codex principles and internationally recognized good practices (harmonization)







### **Eligibility for CTF support**



- Countries with low & medium HDI, other low or middle-income SIDS and LLDCs with high HDI are eligible to apply for CTF support. Eligibility is updated annually (see CTF website).
- For CTF Round 6, a total of 54 countries are eligible for support, out of which there are 4 in CCNE.








### FAO support to the COMESA Trade Facilitation Programme (TFP)

- Guided by the FAO Risk-Based Imported Food Control Manual (2016)




# Food import controls are being modernized

  - legal concepts and institutional arrangements
  - Function that underpin control programme
  - Basic instruments
  - The context
- Identify resource requirements
- Develop a strategic action plan
