Discussion of Highlights of 43rd Session of the Codex Committee of Nutrition and Foods for Special Dietary Uses (CCNFSDU43)

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Meetings

- Meeting held in Germany the week of 6 March, 2023.
- □Virtual participation is possible in listening mode.
- Meeting beginning Monday with 2 physical working groups: NRVs and Work Priorities.





Update to the Standard on Follow-Up Formula

- □One of the key items of Discussion: Update to the Standard on follow-up formula (CXS 156-1987).
- General Work led by New Zealand since 2010 (start of the eWG).
- Covers product characteristics for formula destined to:
 - Part 1: 6-12 month infants and babies.
 - Part 2: 12-36 month babies this latter category is not considered a breast milk substitute in several jurisdictions.
- □ Review of this standard took a significant amount of time and resources and accounted for a great deal of global data.
- □ It will be important that the standard move forward for adoption to recognize this work.





Areas of Discussion

- A. Structure of the Standard:
 - I Standard with 2 parts or
 - 2 separate standards?
 - Prevailing opinion is One Single Standard.
- B. Addition of a preamble to the Standard and the content of the preamble.
- Significant discussion on the second item, with several delegations NOT in favor of including a preamble to the Standard or the possibility of having a very short and factual preamble.





Preamble - Considerations

- Considerations for the preamble:
- Codex standards do not have to include a preamble at all.
- □No guidance in Procedural Manual.
- General practice is to have a preamble that is simple and factual as per previous practice in CCFH, CCExec.





Proposed Preamble and Comments

This Standard is divided into two sections. Section A refers to Follow-up Formula for Older Infants, and Section B deals with Drink for Young Children with Added Nutrients, or Product for Young Children with Added Nutrients, or Drink for Young Children, or Product for Young Children. [The application of this Standard should be consistent with national health and nutrition policies and relevant national/regional legislation and take into account the recommendations made in the International Code of Marketing of Breast-milk Substitutes, as per the national **context**]. Relevant World Health Organization (WHO) guidelines and policies and World Health Assembly (WHA) resolutions were considered in the development of this Standard and may provide further guidance to countries.

The 1st part is factual and would be sufficient.

The 2nd part [bracketed in bold]:

- Mentions facts that are already codified in the Procedural Manual.
- Reminder of formulation of Note 161 in the General Standard for Food Additives (with issues associated with this note).
- The 3rd part (in blue) mentions what was considered in the development / update of the standard. The fact that other requirements apply is also a given and does not need to be added to a standard.



Do Not Delay!

- It will be important to have this issue NOT delay the adoption of the standard:
- The committee has done a lot of work and made significant progress.
- □Agreement on the substance of the standard was reached.
- Existing standard is very much and requires the addition of safeguards as proposed by this update.
- It will be important to have the updated standard in place.





Preamble Necessary?

Should a preamble be indeed necessary, it could be as simple as:

This Standard is divided into two sections. Section A refers to Follow-up Formula for Older Infants, and Section B deals with Drink for Young Children with Added Nutrients, or Product for Young Children with Added Nutrients, or Drink for Young Children, or Product for Young Children.

□ This is similar to a previous practice: Preamble from Infant Formula Standard (CXS 72-1981)

 Divided into 2 sections. Section A refers to Infant Formula and Section B deals with Formulas for Special Medical Purposes intended for Infants.

□ Preamble simple and factual.



□Such addition would allow to move this standard for approval at CAC46.
