INTERNATIONAL BEST PRACTICES ON THE REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF FOOD ADDITIVES*

Introduction

Food additives are chemical substances added to food for the purpose of exerting a technological effect, such as a change in colour, texture or microbiological load.

Food additives are subject to a strong level of oversight by most food regulatory jurisdictions prior to being permitted for use in conjunction with food production. Before authorizing their use, additives are examined for safety and technological effectiveness. It is only when both criteria are fulfilled, meaning when the use is justified and the safety is established, that conditions of such use are established and approved by food regulators.

The conditions of review and approval of food additives adopted by most food regulators internationally are based upon the guidance provided by the Joint Expert Committee on Food Additives (JECFA), which is a risk assessment body, managed by the World Health Organization (WHO) and the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) of the United Nations.

This workshop, co-organized by the Egyptian Chamber of Food Industries (CFI), in Partnership with the National Food Safety Authority of Egypt (NFSA), and the Global Food Regulatory Science Society (GFoRSS) aims to review international best practices related to food additives review and approval, including the JECFA approach, as well as approaches followed by international regulators to assess and approve food additives.

The workshop intends to set the stage for NFSA's food regulatory review dedicated to Food Additive Regulations, as part of the implementation of NFSA's strategic plan for 2023-26 and the commitment made to review key food regulatory provisions promulgated by NFSA to ensure they are aligned with scientific findings and international best practices.

This workshop will set the stage for continued discussions related to food additive approval in Egypt, Arab and African regions.
