

- The Commission is invited to endorse discontinuation of certain draft pesticide residue provisions as proposed by CCPR and referenced in Part 5 of this document.
- The Commission is furthermore invited to note another issue related to the scope of the Guidelines for monitoring the stability and purity of reference materials and related stock solutions of pesticides during prolonged storage and referenced in Part 6 of this document.
- The critical review of these texts will be conducted by the 87th Session of the Executive Committee of the Codex Alimentarius Commission (CCEXEC87).


CRITICAL REVIEW - PART I2

Procedural background for the Critical Review

- 1.1 According to the Procedures for the elaboration of Codex standards and related texts, Part 2, Critical review, in the Codex Procedural Manual, "An ongoing critical review shall ensure that proposals for new work and draft standards submitted to the Commission for adoption continue to meet the strategic priorities of the Commission and can be developed within a reasonable period of time, taking into account the requirements and availability of scientific expert advice". Furthermore, "The Commission decides, taking into account the outcome of the ongoing critical review conducted by the Executive Committee, that a standard should be elaborated and also which subsidiary body or other body should undertake the work".
- 1.2 In line with this, and taking into account the comments of the Chairpersons and the Codex Secretariat. CCEXEC is invited to critically
- · review standards and related texts submitted to the Commission for adoption;
- · monitor the progress of standards development; and
- · review proposals for new work or revision of standards
- Examining proposed standards before submission to the Commission for adoption
- 2.1 The critical review process shall ensure that draft standards submitted to the Commission for adoption have been fully considered at committee level. The Executive Committee examines proposed standards from Codex committees before they are submitted to the Commission for adoption:
 - . for consistency with the mandate of Codex, the decisions of the Commission, and existing Codex
 - to ensure that the requirements of the endorsement procedure have been fulfilled, where appropriate:
 - · for format and presentation; and
 - for linguistic consistency.

Monitoring progress of standards development

The Executive Committee reviews the status of development of draft standards against the timeframe agreed by the Commission and shall report its findings to the Commission, CCEXEC may propose an extension of the timeframe; cancellation of work; or propose that the work be undertaken by a committee other than the one to which it was originally entrusted, including via the establishment of a limited number of subsidiary bodies, if appropriate.



Consequential amendments to the CXLs for peppers groups/subgroups: MRLs for okra	REP24/PR55, paragraph 222(i)(c), Appendix VII	The Codex Secretariat recalled that at CCPR54, the Committee agreed to keep okra in Subgroup 12B (Pepper and pepperlike commodities) in the Classification of Food and Feed (CXA 4-1989) while awaiting the generation of data on okra and subsequent evaluation by JMPR. To implement this decision, consequential amendments were then made to the relevant CXLs for the pepper groups and subgroups.



IPRODIONE/BROCCOLI

120. The EU, supported by Singapore, opposed the advancement of the proposed MRL for broccoli due to an acute toxicity risk identified by JMPR.

Possible refinement when the IESTI exceeds the ARfD

Iprodione

The Meeting concluded that the estimated acute dietary exposure to residues of iprodione for the consumption of broccoli by children may present a public health concern; 190 percent of the ARfD for consumption of cooked/boiled broccoli for toddlers (Netherlands diet).

As no alternative GAP data were available to the Meeting to estimate lower HR values for these commodities, no refinement of the acute dietary exposure estimates was possible. International estimates of short-term intakes can be refined if alternative GAP data become available in the future. In addition, processing data (cooking/boiling) on broccoli might lead to a refinement of the short-term intakes.
