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

Prioritization Matrix Template

Criterion	Guiding Question	Scoring Basis (1–3)
1. Regional Impact	How many Arab countries are directly affected by this item?	Number of affected countries
2. Trade/Food Chain Relevance	Does it impact key export/import commodities or food production systems?	Commodity coverage, trade volume
3. Health Significance	Is there potential for consumer exposure, dietary risk, or vulnerable groups?	Based on JMPR evaluations or food use patterns





Scoring System (1 to 3 Scale)

Criterion	Definition	Score = 1	Score = 2	Score = 3
1. Regional Impact	Number of Arab countries affected or with direct interest	1 countries	2–4countries	5 or more countries
2. Trade Impact	Importance of affected commodities (based on value/volume in the region)	Only consumed in small volumes.	Produced and consumed with moderate trade	Key export or staple crop widely produced
3. Health Significance	Based on JMPR evaluation or national dietary relevance	No health concern identified; exposure far below limits	Exposure is near ADI/ARfD or concern for high-consumption groups	Exposure exceeds limits OR no ADI/ARfD established







Example: Matrix with Quantitative Scoring (1–3 Scale)

Item 6	MRLs for pesticides in food/feed	10 → 3	Tomatoes, grains → 3	Dietary exposure risk → 3	09 High Priority
Item 7	Guidelines for pesticide reference materials	2 → 1	No commodity focus → 1	Low exposure relevance → 1	03 Low Priority
Item 10	Priority list for JMPR evaluations	6 → 2	Multiple crops → 2	Moderate relevance → 2	06 Medium Priority
Item 13	MRLs for tomato/pepper → eggplant	8 → 3 pts	Solanaceae group → 2 pts	Medium risk crop → 2 pts	07 Medium Priority

Scaling:

- 7–9 = High Priority
- 6–7 = Medium Priority
- 3-5 = Low Priority
- < 3 =Only for information






Preparing Analysis Document On The Selected Item

Step 1: Initial Review of Codex Working Documents

- Review the official CCPR56 documents (e.g., CX/PR 25/56/5 and its Addenda).;
- Background information
- Understand the scope and content of the proposed MRLs.
 - Make a list of pesticides for which MRLs are proposed at Step 4 or Step 7,
 - Type of evaluation (new, periodic, additional use); Relevant crops/commodities



Step 2: Review JMPR Evaluations


- Access JMPR reports (both regular and extra meetings, if applicable) related to the pesticides listed.
- Review JMPR's scientific evidence and toxicological assessments.
- Summarize the JMPR recommendations (MRL values; ADI and ARfD; Acute and chronic exposure assessments).



Step 3: Analysis

- Determine if the proposed MRLs are relevant and applicable to the Arab region.
 - Assess local GAPs (Good Agricultural Practices) compared to JMPR evaluation conditions.
 - Consider specific regional factors: Common dietary patterns (e.g., high tomato consumption); Environmental and farming conditions; Gaps in local residue data.
- Evaluate the scientific robustness of the proposal and its health implications for the Arab population.
- Assess the potential impact of the MRLs on intra-regional and international trade (Create new barriers to import or export.
 - Identify Arab countries producing or exporting the affected commodities.
- Determine if Arab countries can feasibly adopt and implement the MRLs (Laboratory capacity; Cost and resource implications of adjusting national legislation...)





Step 4 : Review previous discussions and comments

- **CCPR55** report, CAC reports, and past working group discussions.
- Comments submitted on Circular Letters (CLs), including Arab country positions.
- Analyze points of controversy, reservations, or consensus from previous discussions







❖ Step 5 : Develop a clear position for the Arab region and Recommendations

- Support adoption of the MRL as proposed when no concern is found
- Request revision based on scientific or regional evidence where:
 - There is a risk concern
 - The MRL is unachievable
 - There is insufficient or non-representative data
- Withhold support due to unaddressed concerns (e.g., lack of local data)

Propose:

- Holding MRLs at Step 4
- Withdrawing specific proposals
- Requesting additional JMPR evaluation or Arab-generated data



Step 6: Drafting the Analysis Document (Template-Based)

- Follow the GFoRSS-template format:
 - Title & Agenda Item Reference
 - Document Reference
 - Status in Codex Process (Step 4/7)
 - Background overview of the item, history, and importance
 - Analysis scientific, regional, regulatory, and trade assessment
 - Previous discussions and comments
 - Recommendation proposed position and rationale



Step 7 : Regional Coordination

- Share the draft within CCPR Arab Codex WG for review and consensus.
- Prepare a presentation for inclusion in regional pre-CCPR coordination meetings.
- Ensure alignment with national delegations attending CCPR56.


