Background from CAC47 (Nov 2024)

Overview and Participation

CAC47:

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- Endorsed the final Codex budget report for 2022–2023
- Approved the 2024–2025 budget and noted additional funding needs
- > Acknowledged voluntary contributions from Japan, Korea, and Singapore
- Highlighted two key funding gaps:
 - ✓ Non-recurring: USD 2.1M (special one-time allocation)
 - ✓ Recurrent: USD 2M (permanent budget increase for Codex Secretariat)
- Urged Member advocacy at FAO/WHO to address these needs

➤ Called for:

- ✓ More equitable FAO/WHO funding
- ✓ Cost-effective translation/interpretation
- ✓ Transparent annual cost breakdowns



2024–2025 Biennium: Current Budget Status

Budgeted: USD 8.9 million



- > On track: All activities planned for 2024–2025 are progressing well
- Scientific advice funding (by FAO & WHO):
 FAO: USD 5.7M, mainly from assessed contributions
 WHO: USD 6.3M, largely from voluntary contributions

WHO's reliance on voluntary contributions poses sustainability risks.



2026–2027 Biennium Planning Gap





➢ No Codex budget proposal submitted at CAC47 for 2026–2027

Lack of planning under Rule XIII (which usually governs budget proposals)

Raises concerns about:

✓ Delays in planning core Codex activities ✓ Lack of clarity for future funding sources

✓ Lack of clarity for future funding sources



Recent Developments (2025)

The Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO)

- Proposed 2026–2027 Codex budget remains stable: USD 7.1M
- Increased scientific advice funding from USD 2.6M to USD 3.1M
- FAO Council (April 2025): asked for risk/opportunity assessment on Codex funding (with WHO)

The World Health Organization (WHO)

- No explicit allocation for Codex in its proposed 2026–2027 budget
- > WHO's overall budget (including food safety) may see significant cuts

FAO remains a reliable source; WHO's commitment is uncertain.





Discussion Points

- Dual-agency model (FAO/WHO) needs balanced and sustained support
- > WHO's likely budget reduction could limit scientific input
- > Codex Secretariat identified unfunded priorities under the Strategic Plan
- > There is a lack of:
 - \checkmark Operational clarity on how funds are used
 - ✓ Transparency in decision-making on financial priorities

Member States must engage early to influence Codex budget decisions
