# Report of the 40<sup>th</sup> Meeting of Arab Countries Codex Contact Points - Chaired by the CCNE Coordinator

# <u>Preparatory Meeting for the Twelfth Session of the Regional Coordinating Committee for the Near East (CCNE12)</u>

As part of the preparations for the Twelfth Session of the Regional Coordinating Committee for the Near East (CCNE12), scheduled to be held in Muscat, Sultanate of Oman, from 28 September to 2 October 2025, the 40th Meeting of Arab Countires /CCNE Codex Contact was held virtually on Monday, September 8, 2025, the meeting was chaired by the CCNE Coordinator and attended by representatives from the following countries:

Dr. Intisar Algharibi, Regional Coordinator for the Near East, opened the meeting with a welcoming address, expressing her gratitude and appreciation to the participants for accepting the invitation and attending this important gathering. In her remarks, she highlighted that this meeting falls within the framework of strengthening coordination and collective work to achieve common objectives. She also stressed that the success of the upcoming meeting depends on accurate coordination and proper preparation, which constitutes the main purpose of today's meeting through planning and discussing the proposed priorities. She further presented the agenda items of the Twelfth Session of the FAO/WHO Coordinating Committee for the Near East (CCNE12). She concluded her statement by expressing her hope that the upcoming meeting will achieve fruitful results that contribute to supporting the work of the Codex Alimentarius and enhancing regional cooperation.

Following that, Eng. Ahmed Eddouaicer, the Arab Codex Initiative, welcomed the participants, extending thanks to Dr. Algharibi for her remarks and wishing success for the meeting and the presentations. He also announced the convening of the Colloquium on the Joint FAO / WHO Food Standards Program Codex Committee on Spices and Culinary Herbs, scheduled to be held on 22 September 2025. He noted that this Colloquium will be managed for the first time by the Coordinator of the Arab Codex Initiative.

#### Item 3: Updates on the following topics

#### 1. Draft Regional Standard on Maamoul (Step 7) - Kingdom of Saudi Arabia

The electronic working group chaired by Saudi Arabia and Lebanon finalized the Draft Regional Standard for Maamoul, following its adoption at Step 5 by the Codex Alimentarius Commission (CAC46). Improvements introduced included: quality factors such as pH, moisture content, water activity, control of foreign matter contaminants, and the addition of proposed methods of analysis. The group recommended considering the work as complete and forwarding it to the Committee for adoption at Step 8 by the Commission, with referral of matters relating to contaminants, additives, labelling, and methods of analysis to the respective specialized committees for endorsement.

#### 2. Discussion paper on a framework for collecting data on footnote c of Codex Standard CXS 33

#### - Syrian Arab Republic

Syria presented a discussion paper focusing on mechanisms for data collection to evaluate the applicability of footnote (c) under paragraph 3.2.3 of the Codex Standard for Olive Oils and Olive Pomace Oils (CXS 33-1981), with emphasis on authenticity indicators such as sterol composition. The aim is to ensure that current revisions of the standard adequately reflect regional variations and prevent misclassification of authentic olive oils, particularly those produced in Syria and other areas with similar climatic and agricultural conditions. Syria noted that the paper has been submitted to the Codex Secretariat and encouraged member countries to review its details and provide support during the Committee meeting.

### 3. Project Document : justification for the drafting of codex standard for rose water — Islamic Republic of Iran

Iran presented strong justifications for the development of an international standard for rose water, citing the significant growth of the global market (USD 477 million in 2024, projected to reach around USD 972 million by 2033). The document highlighted the need to harmonize quality standards, labelling, and contaminant limits in order to combat adulteration, ensure consumer confidence, promote fair trade, and facilitate access to international markets.

## 4. Discussion Paper related to Food Contact Materials — International Union of Food Science and Technology (IUFoST)

The paper reviewed the role of food contact materials in food safety and the sustainability of food systems, and the challenges arising from the absence of a harmonized framework within Codex, particularly regarding non-intentionally added substances (NIAS) and recycled materials. Three options for Codex work were outlined:

- Through existing committees,
- Establishment of a dedicated working group,

 A phased approach (recommended), beginning with a comparative study and expert work in 2025, leading to core texts and an endorsed list by 2029.

# Item 4: Project for Developing a 2026–2028 Workplan for Near East Region Countries within the Framework of Implementing the Codex Strategic Plan 2026-2031

Dr. Intisar Algharibi, Regional Coordinator for the Near East, presented a discussion paper outlining the regional priorities for 2026–2028 within the framework of the Codex Strategic Plan 2026–2031. She underlined the importance of developing scientific standards that address the region's needs, strengthening capacities and active participation in Codex work, and maximizing impact through the adoption and harmonization of regional standards. She invited participants to review the paper and share their proposals to help shape the region's plans for the coming phase.

She also highlighted the side events accompanying the Twelfth Session, noting that three events will be organized by FAO, WHO, and the Sultanate of Oman. She added that the detailed program schedule will be circulated once finalized.

In her closing remarks, she expressed her hope of seeing the participation of all countries in the next session, stressing the importance of such engagement for the region, and wished all participants success.
